Applications are invited for a Term Adjunct to teach 33.3% of a virtual course entitled
HPE 803: Scholarship in Health Professions Education

Course Level: Graduate

Location: onQ and Zoom

Anticipated Enrolment: 23

Period of Appointment: January 1 – April 30, 2025

The Master of Health Professions Education is a program in which every course is team-taught by a health professional and an educationalist PhD.

Course Description:

HPE 803 has been designed to establish a foundation from which learners can engage in scholarship across diverse disciplines, ontologies, and pedagogical approaches. The course covers a range of scholarly approaches, including an overview of literature search strategies, operationalizing conceptual frameworks, and critically appraising the validity and reliability of the scholarly inferences resulting from data analyses.

Qualifications for the Appointment:

A doctorate in education or relevant field with at least two years of post-doctoral experience relevant to the field of instruction.

As this course is being offered in an online format, successful candidates will also:

- Have regular access to high speed internet and a computer that meets current specifications
- Be willing to team-teach
- Take an active role in delivering the course through Zoom and onQ
- Communicate regularly with students
- Be open to learning how to use new technologies in order to be effective in the virtual environment
- Be available Thursdays from 4:30 – 6:30 PM ET Canada for six (6) Zoom sessions throughout term (January – April)
- Be willing to provide students with timely and constructive feedback on onQ
- Be comfortable with working in a partnership in the delivery of the course

Application Materials:

Individuals interested in applying for this term adjunct teaching position should submit an application by September 18th, 2024. The application shall include:

- A cover letter
- A complete and current curriculum vitae (CV)
- The names of two referees who may be contacted
- Any other materials the applicant wishes to submit (such as a teaching dossier)
