- Global health (GH): health issues that transcends national borders
  - Process of addressing these health issues through resource-sharing and partnerships to create sustainable changes
  - Focus is placed on promoting health equity through advocacy

## **Certificate Requirements- Overview**



- Service learning
- Placement
  - Pre-departure training
  - Post-departure debrief
- Online modules
- Educational sessions
- Mentorship



- Students will provide a service to a Kingston organization that works with underserviced populations
- Students must commit to work with the organization for at least two semesters
- Program Requirements:
  - Service learning project proposal (that is approved by the OGH)
  - Reflection piece (in written or presentation form) approved by your supervisor at the organization



- Placements need to be in a low-resource setting in Canada or abroad
- Pre-clerkship students: Complete a 4-week GH observership
- Clerkship students: Complete a 3-week GH elective
- Students are responsible for organizing the logistics of their placement
- Program Requirements:
  - Placement database application
  - OCASP form
  - Attend pre-departure training, pre-departure interview, and postdeparture debrief

## **Placement Requirements – Pre Departure Training**



- Each student will be given a pre-departure manual
- Prior to the training session students are required to:
  - Complete Queen's University online pre-departure training module
  - Read assigned GH ethics articles
- Training topics include:
  - Personal health
  - Travel safety
  - Language competencies
  - Cultural Humility
  - Medical and Personal Ethical Considerations
  - Medical Tourism
- Session will be conducted through: lectures, group discussions, and case-based learning

## **Placement Requirements – Post Departure Debrief**



- Session is to debrief on:
  - Achievement of learning objectives
  - Positive and negative experiences in your placement
  - Lessons learned
- Program Requirements:
  - Submit a written reflection
  - Attend a post-departure debrief session (group or individual)



 Educational sessions can be lectures, panels, journal clubs, documentary screenings on pertinent global health issues

 Certificate students are asked to present once on their service-learning project or placement abroad

#### **Certificate Requirement:**

- Attend a minimum of 8 sessions
- Present at one session

## **Program Requirements – Online Modules**



- There are 7 self-directed, online modules on:
  - International Development
  - Infectious Diseases
  - Non-Communicable Diseases
  - Hunger
  - Sexuality and Gender
  - Maternal Health
  - Infant and Child Health

### **Certificate Requirement:**

Complete online modules
