There were two people to a room. Each room had 2 single beds, a closet, desk and chair and sink/mirror. There are communal bathrooms and showers. There is a common room, kitchen and dining hall. Breakfast, lunch and dinner were usually provided. The retreat house is cold and I wish I had brought more warm clothing. In addition, the showers were not always warm but there isn't anything you can really do about that. Accommodation cost: Included

least \$500 USD in cash because there will be short tourist trips, trips to the Inka market for souvenirs and you will have to purchase some of your own meals
