## PROGRAMS IN Aging and Health

### Graduate Diploma, Master of Science and Doctoral Programs



Queen's University Graduate Diploma (GDip), Master of Science (MSc) and Doctorate (PhD) in Aging and Health are innovative programs that provide participants with a comprehensive understanding of aging, with a focus on health and healthy living. Students will develop multi-disciplinary knowledge of individual aging processes, the effect of aging on social systems, and the policies needed to support healthy aging.

All three programs can be completed from a distance, through a blended format of on-line and in-person learning. Intensive on-site sessions introduce students to core courses and the elearning technology, as well as provide an opportunity for in-person interaction with faculty and fellow class members. Elective courses are completed at a distance, on-line. The blended format of on-site intensives and on-line components couples networking and experiential opportunities with the flexibility of distance learning.

The Queen's University GDip, success in a variety of settings, government, for-profit and non-profit. The PhD program will also be prepared.

The GDip and MSc are open to applicants who have graduated from a university with an overall B+ average. For admission to the PhD program, applicants should have a PhD or equivalent.

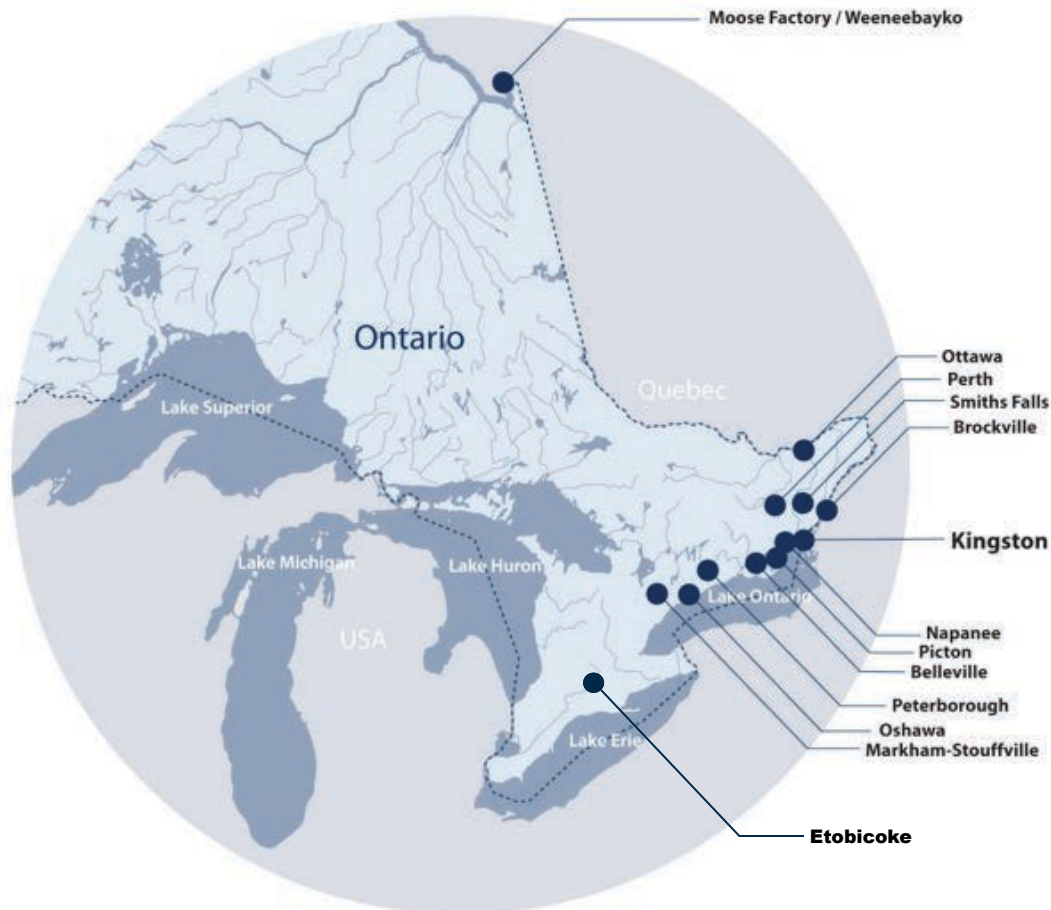

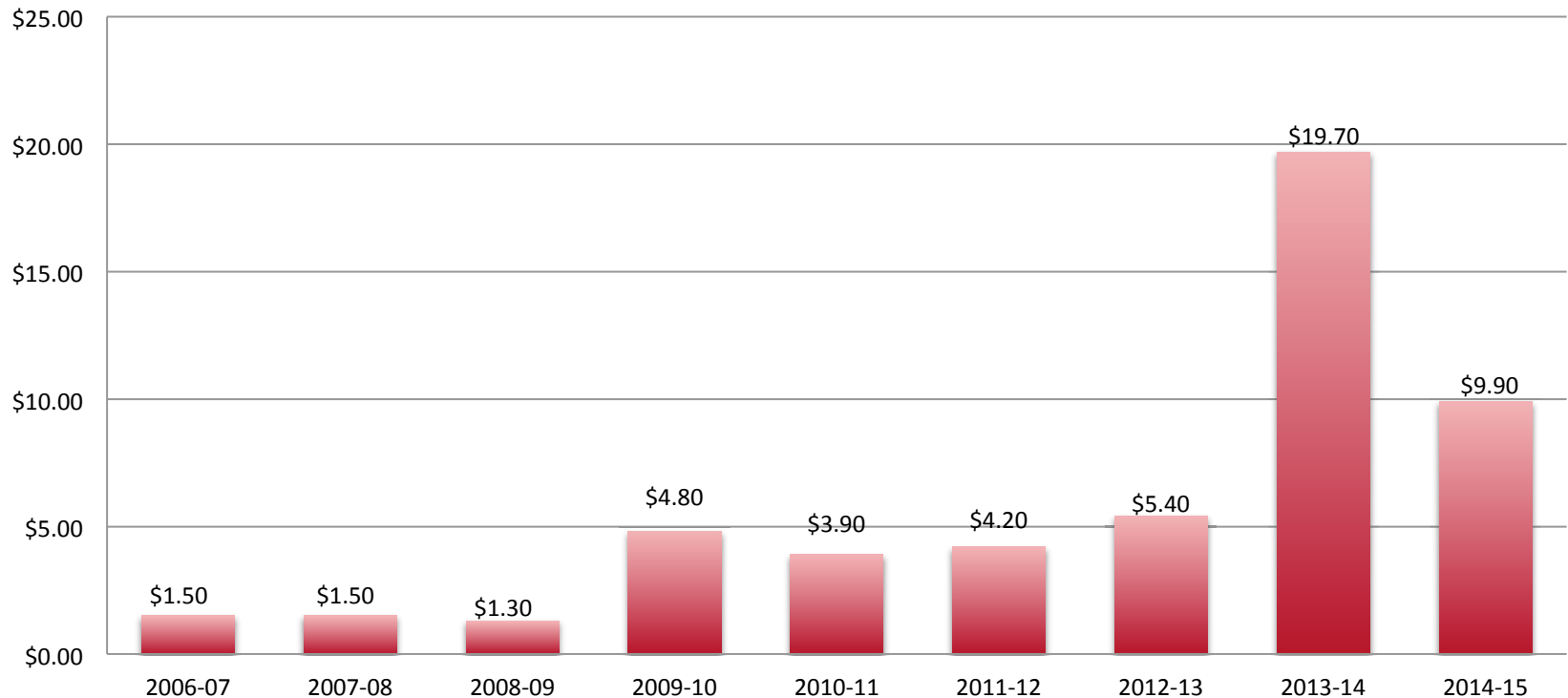

Year by year campaign progress (\$M)

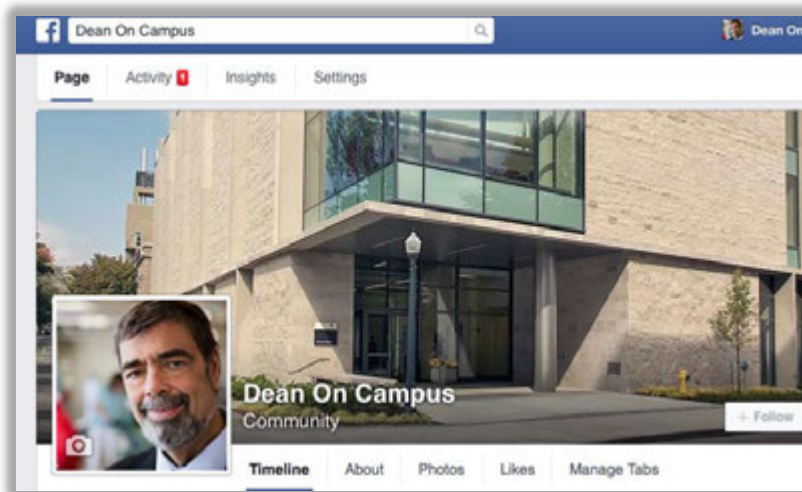
