

H. F. Pross Educational Technology Award - Terms of Reference

Nature of Award

The H.F. Pross Award was established in the School of Medicine at Queen's University in 2004 to honour Dr. Hugh Pross in recognition of his multiple contributions to this School.

Eligibility

All Queen's faculty and staff members with an affiliation with the School of Medicine are eligible to be nominated for the H.F. Pross Award.

Nominees will have demonstrated leadership in the innovative use of educational technology in medical education, and nominations will be assessed for innovation and for relevance to the strategic directions of the School of Medicine.

Nomination Procedure

Any faculty member, resident or medical student, (or group thereof) in the School of Medicine can make a nomination.

Nominations should consist of a completed copy of the attached nomination form and a detailed letter outlining the reasons for the nomination. A resume of the nominee is not needed, nor will it be considered if submitted.

Nominations are to be submitted annually to the office of the Vice-Dean, Health Sciences Education.

All nominees will receive a letter informing them of their nomination.

Selection Procedure

Selection will be made by a committee appointed by the Vice-Dean, Health Sciences Education, and will include:

- the Vice-Dean, Health Sciences Education (Chair);
- the Assistant Dean, Professional Development;
- an Educational Developer;
- the Health Informatics Librarian (Bracken); and
- a representative from the Aesculapian Society.
