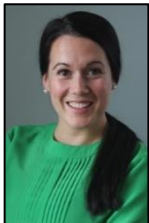
Mental Health Research: Through the Administrative Data Looking Glass

Dr. Katie Goldie
School of Nursing, Queen's University

Dr. Goldie is exploring whether poor mental health contributes to increased risk for cardiovascular disease; and whether these associations differ by sex. Her goal is to increase our knowledge regarding the assessment and identification of antecedents to cardiovascular disease.



Dr. Alyson Mahar
Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Manitoba & Manitoba Centre for Health Policy

Dr. Mahar's work focuses on access and quality of healthcare for vulnerable populations. Using routinely collected health administrative or survey data her research addresses gaps in our understanding of issues and outcomes for vulnerable populations, such as patients with high mortality cancers and combined psychiatric illness and cancer. She also examines the health of Veterans and military families.



Dr. Dallas Seitz
Department of Psychiatry, Division of Geriatric Psychiatry, Queen's University

Dr. Seitz is Chair of the Division of Geriatric Psychiatry at Queen's, and Clinical Director of the Seniors Mental Health Program at Providence Care. His current research examines health service utilization of older adults with psychiatric disorders; evaluation of the safety and efficacy of treatments for geriatric mental health conditions; and knowledge translation in geriatric mental health.
