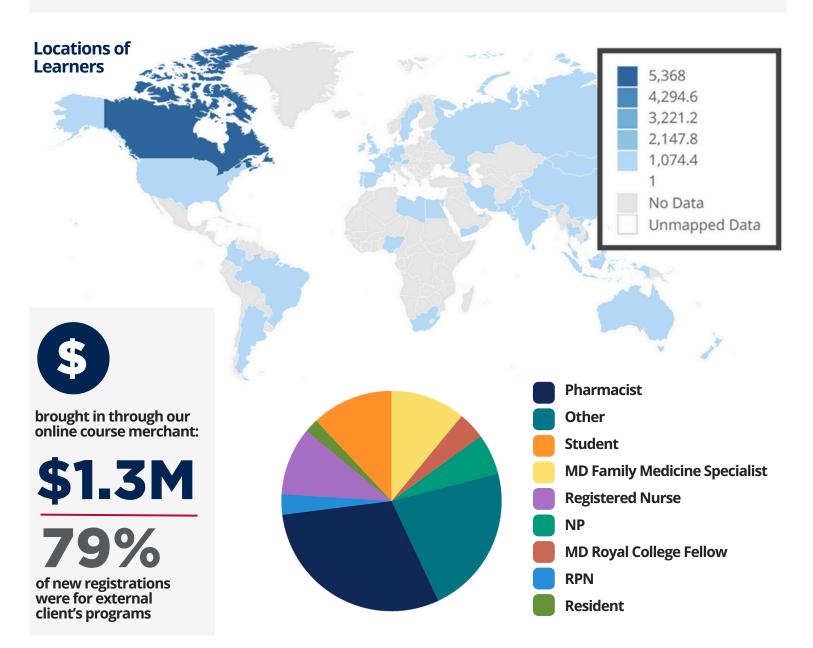

Coroner's Maintenance of Competence

Accredited curriculum developed in collaboration with the Office of the Chief Coroner of Ontario. The program is designed to ensure that every Coroner in Ontario has ongoing training to effectively meet and maintain the ability to "speak for the dead to protect the living." These new modules are a continuation of a multi-year partnership with the Office of the Chief Coroner of Ontario, going as far back as 2020. 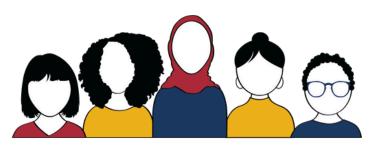
